His interest in locks, keys & mechanical equipment stems from early involvement in the 1945 family business now developed into Lawnmowerworld and Lockandkeyworld specialising in Service, Spares, Restoration, Locks, Keys and Safes

The Museum has become one of the world's leading authorities. Housing an extensive archive service on vintage lawnmowers and is the largest specialist in antique & classic garden machinery including the conservation of original patents, blueprints & memorabilia from 1799.

In this unique in the world, national collection are manufacturers not normally associated with the garden industry, names such as Rolls Royce, Royal Enfield, Vincent, Dennis, Hawker Sidley, Perkins, Leyland Motors, Fraser Nash and more. Many exhibits, memorabilia and industrial artefacts are from the Victorian and Edwardian eras and have been restored to keep a small part of British engineering heritage alive.

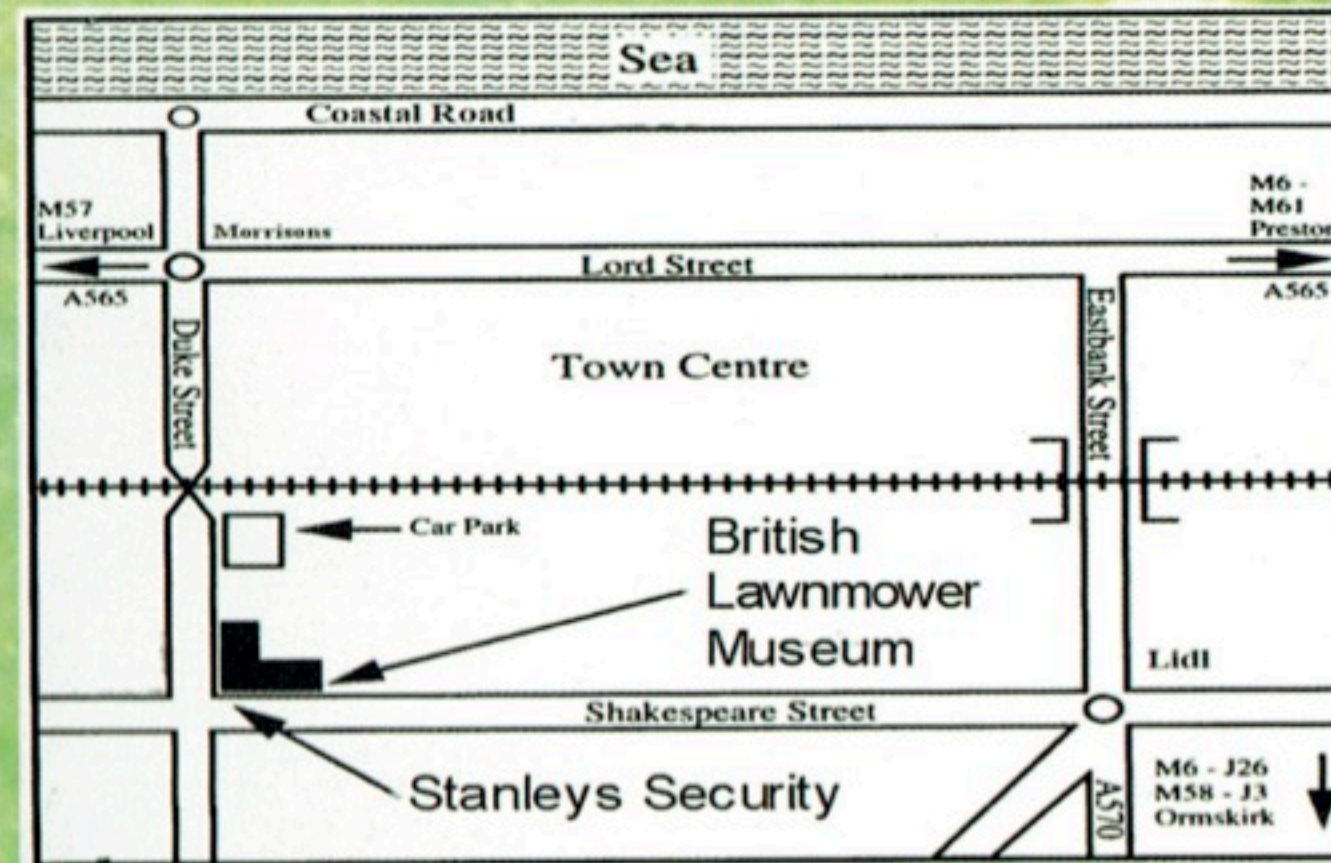

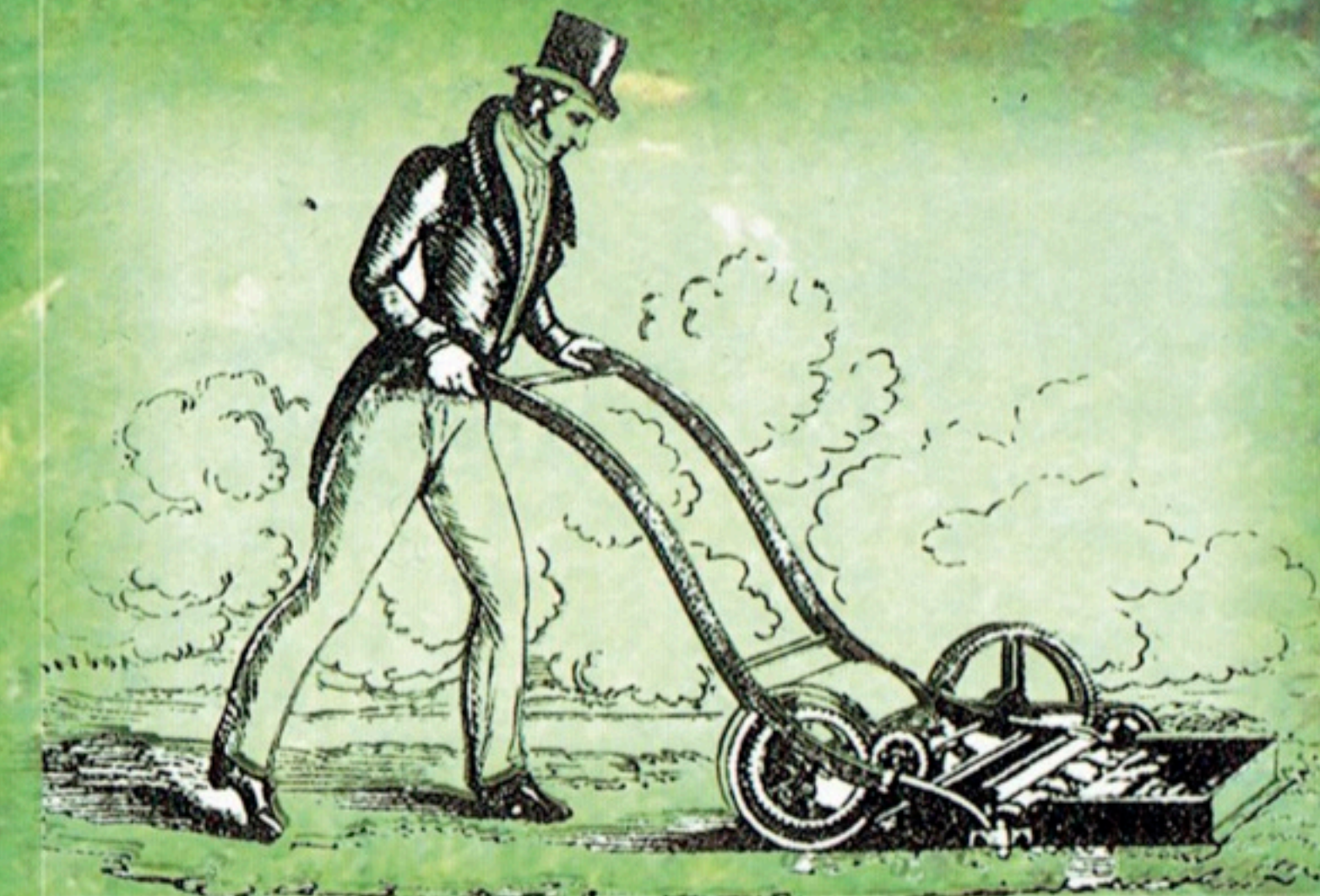


The museum is located in the picturesque Victorian seaside resort of Southport, easily accessible from Manchester International & Liverpool John Lennon airports, M6, M57 M58.

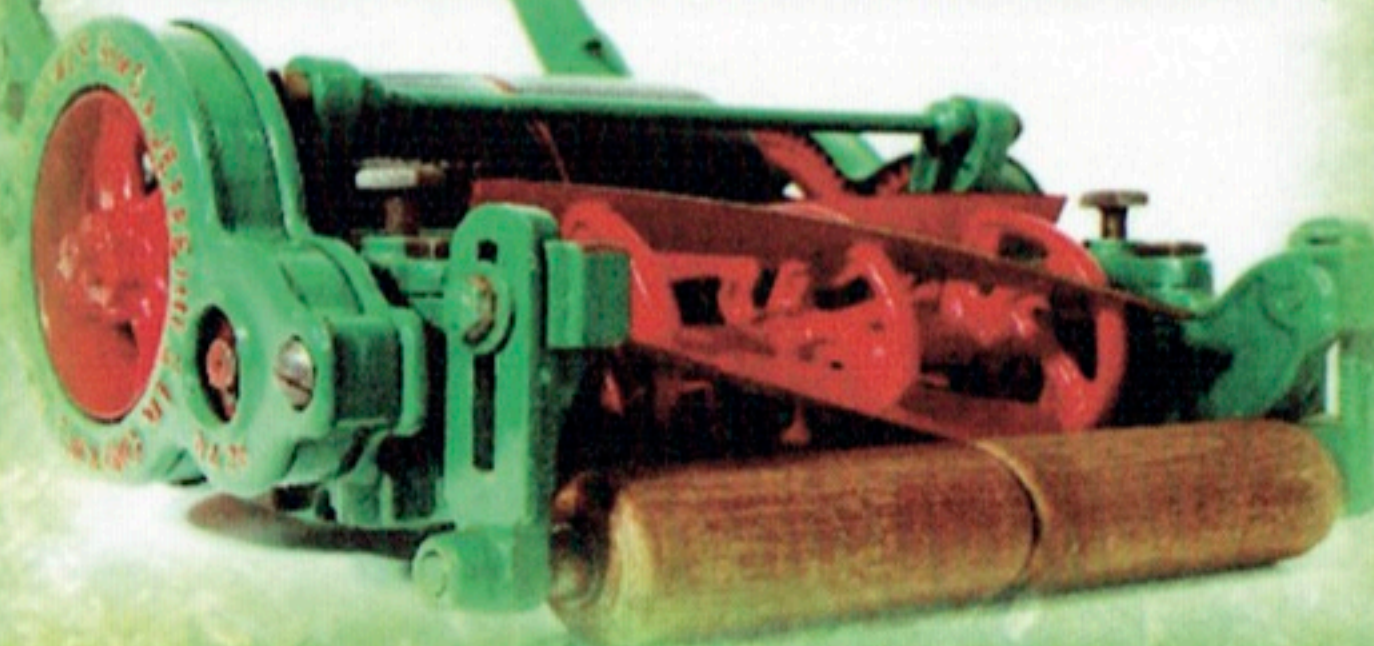

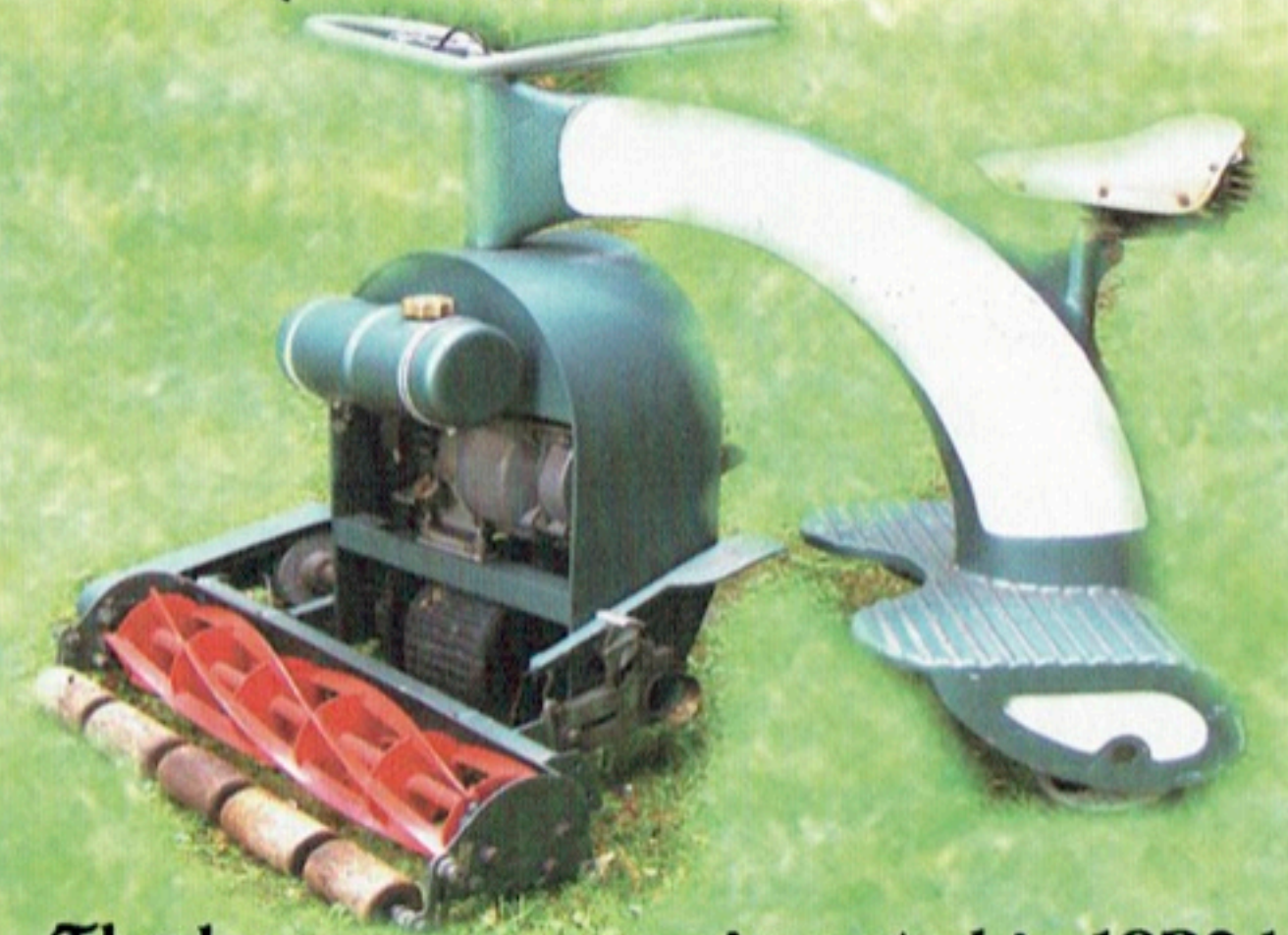

The multi award winning Museum featured worldwide on TV & radio with Robbie Coltrane, Antiques Roadshow & many more. It houses a collection of over 400 pristine exhibits of special interest, part of 1000 built up over a period of 80 years. A tribute to the garden machine industry developed over the past 200 years from the Industrial Revolution to the present day. Many have been rescued from the scrap yard and restored to original condition. The museum displays the largest collection of memorabilia & vintage toy lawn mowers in the world.



The lawnmower was invented in 1830 by Edwin Beard Budding of Gloucester, thought of as a madman he had to test his strange contraption at night. Originally designed to trim the nap from cloth, the environmentally friendly cylinder cutting machine he devised has not changed in principle since that date and has been the traditional lawnmower for formal lawns used throughout Great Britain, whereas many other countries favour the rotary grass cutter introduced in the 1930's.
